Once the assessment is completed you will receive valuable feedback to support fire mitigation on your property, including details about potential savings on state taxes and homeowner's insurance information.

LOCAL MITIGATION PROJECTS

In early 2023 the Pinewood Springs Fire Protection District applied for and received a grant from Larimer County OEM to perform wildfire mitigation on public space near the water tanks.

Recent incident on snowy US 36

In early February our volunteer firefighters were responding to a vehicle emergency at mile marker 9, between Pinewood Springs and Estes Park. It was a wintery night, and the roads were slick and dangerous. While emergency response teams worked to handle the situation, a pick-up truck passing by the scene lost control and hit the rear corner of Pinewood Springs Fire Engine 5131. No one on the scene was seriously injured.

Pay attention to emergency vehicles and heed flashing emergency signals.

Slow down and remember, 4-wheel drive does not help you stop faster.

Every winter our Pinewood Springs Volunteer Fire Fighters respond to multiple snow- and ice-related vehicle incidents. There are many drivers on our highway who are not used to mountain and winter driving, so be patient, exercise caution, and leave extra room between your vehicle and others on the road.
